Reg: Decisions of the Examination Committee held on 06.12.2018 duly approved by Governing Body on 17.12.2018 and amendment in rules of the Examination Bye-laws

The Examination Committee at its meeting on 06.12.2018 has resolved as under which has also been approved by the Governing Body at its meeting held on 17.12.2018:

I. ISSUING SINGLE CERTIFICATE AT SECONDARY LEVEL EXAMINATION COMBINING THE LANGUAGE OF THE MARKSHEET AND CERTIFICATE AND AMENDMENT IN RULE 63 OF THE EXAMINATION BYE-LAWS RELATING TO CERTIFICATION

Following is the decision w.e.f. 2019 examination:

- A. a single certificate at Secondary level examination combining the language of the Marksheet and Certificate shall be issued w.e.f. 2019 examination of Class X:
- B. in respect of PASS/COMPTT/FAIL candidates the result shall be reflected as PASS/COMPTT./FAIL;
- C. in respect of IMPROVEMENT/ADDITIONAL SUBJECT the result shall be shown as "xxxx";
- D. the document shall be treated as a Certificate and candidates shall have to fulfil the requirements as notified by the Board for obtaining duplicate/triplicate certificate
- E. Rule 63 of the Examination Bye-laws be read as under:

V. ISSUING OF REGISTRATION CARDS TO CLASS IX AND XI STUDENTS BY THE RESPECTIVE SCHOOLS

Following is the decision w.e.f. academic session 2018-2019 of Class IX and XI:

- (i) For 2018-2019 session of Class IX/XI schools shall provide the registration card to the students;
- (ii) Modalities and Standard Operating Procedure for issuing Registration Cards will be prepared and circulated to the schools;
- (iii) W.e.f. academic session 2019-2020 of class IX/XI an amount to be paid to the schools for this work shall be decided and communicated to the schools by the CBSE
- (iv) Immediately after registration of their students, school shall provide registration card to their students in the manner and specifications as to be intimated to the schools by CBSE.

VI. DIRECT ADMISSIONS IN CLASSES X AND XII W.E.F. ACADEMIC SESSION 2019-2020

- (i) Admission in Class IX and XI shall be considered by a school only as per the strength sanctioned by the Affiliation Branch;
- (ii) after 15th July, direct admission in Class X and XII be not considered except in the case of transfer of parent(s)
- (iii) Processing fee of Rs.1000/- shall be levied for the request of each direct admission/re-admission case
- (iv) Same schedule and last date shall be applicable for readmission

VII. POLICY FOR REDUCING MISTAKES IN STUDENT'S DATA SUBMITTED BY SCHOOLS DURING REGISTRATION IN CLASS IX/XI AND IN LIST OF CANDIDATES IN CLASS X/XII W.E.F. ACADEMIC SESSION 2019-2020

- (i) Schools shall send communication to the parents before registration and submission of List of Candidates about the precautions which are required to be taken when providing information/details of their ward for Registration in Class IX/XI and in List of Candidates in Class X/XII;
- (ii) after issuing Registration cards, schools shall issue circular to their students/parents to verify the spellings of the name of student, mother, father/guardian and date of birth of the student;
- (iii) correction, if any, be communicated to the Board by January end of the session of class IX/XI which shall be the 1st opportunity for getting particulars corrected;
- (iv) 2nd opportunity shall be made available latest by November end of the next academic session i.e. when the students would be in Class X/XII. This schedule will be one month after the last date of 3rd late fee slab of submission of list of candidates of Class X/XII;
- (v) School shall also send the information on the registered mobile number of parent(s) by providing details and to inform to the school, correction required, if any
- (vi) 3rd opportunity shall be made available through admit cards by providing information to the parents which would also be signed by the parents and the same will be checked by both - parent school and centre school
- (vii) Processing fee of Rs.1000/- shall be levied after submission of LOC for Class X/XII.

VIII. MODIFIED EVALUATION METHOD FOR 2019 EXAMINATION

Evaluation system has been modified for 2019 examination and the same has been made available to the schools in the Guidelines for Spot Evaluation for 2019 examination.

IX. LIMITING THE NUMBER OF YEARS IN WHICH FAIL CANDIDATES CAN RE-APPEAR FOR THE CLASS X AND XII EXAMINATIONS

Following is the decision w.e.f. 2020 examination:

- (i) Fail candidates shall be permitted to appear only in the next year after the first attempt to be in consonance with Rule 42A of carrying over of practical marks for fail candidates;
- (ii) Compartment candidates shall be permitted to appear only till the 3rd chance Comptt. examination
- (iii) Candidates shall be permitted to appear for improvement of performance as per existing Rule 44 of Examination Bye-laws;
- (iv) Rules 17, 18, 20 and 21 of the Examination Bye-laws be read as under:

X. PASS CRITERIA FOR CLASS X CANDIDATES 2019 ONWARDS

The pass criteria for Class X candidates as circulated vide Notification no. CBSE/COORD/DS/EC/2018 dated 11.10.2018 shall be applicable w.e.f. 2019 examinations onwards.

XI. EXEMPTIONS/ CONCESSIONS BEING EXTENDED TO PERSONS WITH BENCHMARK DISABILITIES FOR CLASS X & XII EXAMINATIONS CONDUCTED BY THE CBSE AND STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE

Exemptions/Concessions being extended to candidates with disabilities as per Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 have been compiled vide Circular No. CBSE/COORD/112233/2018 dated 26th September, 2018, Circular no. CBSE/Coord/DS/2018 dated 5.11.2018 and Corrigendum dated 29.11.2018 and are available on Board's website.

XII. AWARDING MARKS ON PRO-RATA BASIS AND SEPARATE PASS IN THEORY AND INTERNAL ASSESSMENT/PROJECT IN THE SUBJECTS OF HINDI CORE & HINDI ELECTIVE AT SENIOR LEVEL, W.E.F. 2019 EXAMINATION

Following are the decisions w.e.f. 2019 examination:

- (i) result in respect of Fail/Comptt./Additional Subject/Improvement candidates shall be computed out of 100 on pro-rata basis;
- (ii) regarding pass in theory and Internal Assessment/Project to declare a candidate as pass in the subject Hindi Core or Hindi Elective, a candidate must obtain 33% marks separately in theory and project(including ASL) in addition to 33% marks in aggregate

in order to qualify in that subject, as is being done in other subjects having project component.

XIII. APPOINTING TGTs AS HEAD EXAMINERS, ESPECIALLY IN THE SUBJECTS OF SCIENCE AND SOCIAL SCIENCE AND AMENDING RULE 53 OF EXAMINATION BYE-LAWS RELATING TO CRITERIA FOR APPOINTMENT OF HEAD EXAMINERS

Following decisions have been taken w.e.f. 2019 examination:

- (i) TGTs may be considered to be appointed as Head Examiners in the required subjects at Class X level w.e.f. 2019 examination; and
- (ii) Rule 53(i) of Examination Bye-laws be read as under:

XIV. CONDUCT OF PRACTICAL EXAMINATIONS AT THE IDENTIFIED THEORY EXAMINATION CENTRES FOR ALL PRACTICAL BASED SUBJECTS W.E.F. 2020 EXAMINATIONS

Following decisions have been taken w.e.f. 2020 examination:

- (i) CBSE may consider conducting practical examination at the theory examination centre w.e.f. 2020 examination;
- (ii) Standard Operating Procedures and detailed marking scheme to be implemented for practical examination may also be developed.
